



CFC RECOGNIZES SCHRIEVER NCO AS ‘NATIONAL HERO’

Tech. Sgt. Sherrie Horn, director of operations with the Air Force Technical Applications Center Detachment 46 at Schriever Air Force Base was announced as one of three national Combined Federal Campaign Military Heroes by the Office of Personnel Management. Sgt. Horn traveled to the White House in June to accept the award.

Sgt Horn’s nomination was selected from among over 40 nominations submitted to the national committee. Nominees may have served as campaign coordinators, keyworkers, campaign volunteers, or LFCC members. The committee selected individuals who made a

significant difference during the 2004 campaign by demonstrating leadership qualities, such as establishing direction, and aligning, motivating and inspiring people. The nominees also had a significant commitment to volunteerism on a personal level, outside the workplace.

As a CFC key worker, Sergeant Horn helped Schriever Air Force Base achieve a 10-percent increase in participation and a 36-percent increase in contributions by doubling her unit’s donations and cultivating a 28% increase in participation. Her unit achieved a participation rate of 90% and contributed over 300% of their goal.

Helping the community and families is an integral part of TSgt Horn’s life. Some of her community involvement activities include sponsoring special needs children for the Special Olympics and Operation Angel, teaching Sunday school, helping the Schriever 5/6 Council with fundraisers, and working the Fisher House, Habitat for Humanity, Greccio Housing Project, United Way and Care & Share Food Bank.
